A PASTORAL DAY WITH BILL HUEBSCH On Thursday 26 October, Bill Huebsch, an internationally renowned theologian, catechist and writer, will be visiting the Diocese and leading a day on his most recent book, "The Art of Accompaniment." In this pastoral workshop, Bill will help us explore Pope Francis' frequent proposals that the Church needs to be open and trained so that we can accompany people from all walks of life on their faith journeys – from the very earliest steps through to major discernment about life choices. A CHURCH WITHOUT PRIESTS? A lecture given by Professor Werner Jeanrond, Master of St Benet's Hall at Oxford University on 'A Church without Priests? - The need for new forms of leadership in the Catholic Church' will be held at Holy Name Church, 7 North Jesmond Avenue, Jesmond, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE2 3JX on Thursday 26 October at 7pm. Professor Werner Jeanrond is one of the most important theologians working in Britain today and has taught in several European countries. Professor Jeanrond believes the renewal of our Church requires a radical rethinking of ministry.

THE PIVOTAL PLAYER A series of talks by Bishop Robert Barron reflecting on the life and work of some of the Church's most influential people is being shown on DVD at St Patrick's Parish Centre in Felling on a Monday evening from 6.30pm to 8pm. This will commence on Monday 30 October and admission is free. In these DVDs you will discover the places where St Thomas Aquinas lived, learned, and wrote.
