A truly heartfelt thank you to everyone who attended and contributed in any way to this wonderfully successful evening which celebrated the amalgamation of our three churches in becoming one amazing Parish - 'Our Lady and St Philip Neri.' We are an incredible Church Family and I feel blessed to be part of it.

Right from the conception of this ambitious idea, by the Parish Pastoral Council, of hiring a marquee and organising a Celebration Mass, we commenced a journey of success - some parishioners immediately contributed £1000 towards the overall cost, then a further £151 was donated towards food. A team of volunteers made this event happen, they planned for weeks, organised the marquee, entertainment, Mass (choir practices, order of service, etc) and shopped till they dropped!

This family evening commenced with a spiritually uplifting Thanksgiving Mass, continued with a Prosecco reception which accompanied gourmet food (provided by our wonderful parishioners), then live entertainment was enjoyed by all. Glasses were frequently refreshed with Prosecco followed by wine throughout the night.

The children took advantage of the brilliant weather-playing with the outdoor games, bubbles and running around (not sitting in front of a computer or attached to a phone) - the sweets, water and juice stall was frequently patronised, by adults as well as children. The evening was amazing, brilliant, awesome, wonderful, incredible and just so special, words fail me.

The only hiccup was a forgotten cake, however, this was remembered then rectified, taken to be enjoyed by parishioners at both St Mary's and Immaculate Heart coffee mornings at the following Sunday Masses. Once again, I'm hugely grateful to everyone.

THE 46th ANNUAL BLESSED JOHN INGRAM WALK The Annual Blessed John Ingram Walk takes place next Sunday 22 July, starting in Newcastle and concluding near the place of his martyrdom on Gateshead High Street. The Walk begins near the site of the prison, where Blessed John Ingram was held, at St Andrew's Anglican Church, Newgate Street, Newcastle. Please gather here for 2.30pm for a short prayer service at 2.45pm. The walk will proceed down through the Big Market and across the Swing Bridge, walking up to Gateshead High Street, and assembling at the site of St Edmund's Chapel (now called Holy Trinity) located at the bottom of Jackson Street. This is the exact location where our Priest Martyr was executed. There we will have an Ecumenical Service, followed by refreshments. If you would like to take part without doing the Walk, please assemble at St Edmund's at 3.30pm. As our Partnership of Gateshead parishes carries his name, we hope more of us will come along to commemorate his sacrifice for the Catholic faith on 26 July 1594 at the age of 29 years.
