

PARISH FINANCIAL UPDATE The Parish Finance Committee met on 9 May to review the financial year 2018/19 and subsequently sign off the Diocesan Annual Returns and related appendices for submission by the 31 May deadline.

2018/19 proved to be another successful year with a surplus of £19,800 on parish and hall activities. This is down on the exceptional surplus of £32,000 last year but repair spend is £14,450 higher due, mainly, to the work on St Mary's church roof at a cost of £12,480.

Total funds across the parish current and deposit accounts stood at £264,000 at the end of March which includes £5,743 held on behalf of *Gift for Life*, £3,750 for Palazzola deposits and £1,226 for special collections to be paid after year-end.

It is encouraging to report that offertory collections were up by 2.3% to £71,495 while Gift Aid claims were up 4.9% at £14,423.

Once again we thank you for your ongoing generosity in supporting the mission and maintenance of our parish.

Every now and then it is important to reflect on what we are doing and what else we could do. The latest meeting of the *Gift for Life* group did just that. Firstly we celebrated the amazing generosity of all those who already support our two main causes – the Little Sisters in Kenya and the Balamma Satram project in India. Our ambition this year is to donate £3,600 to each to support those in dire need of food, water, health and education. A recent e-mail from Kenya says it all – '*We thank God for all that Gift for Life is doing for the people of God and for humanity.*'

Of course, there is always more that can be done and the group is looking to increase funds so that other causes – whether at the other side of the street or the other side of the world – can be supported too.
