

Light refreshments will be available after the Mass to enable people to mingle, chat, and get to know each other.

*THE MARTYRS OF THE DIOCESE Of the 315 of our Catholic ancestors who sacrificed their lives during the religious persecutions of the 16th and 17th centuries, 28 can be considered 'Martyrs of the North', as they were born, laboured or suffered within the confines of Northumberland and Durham. To return to England as a priest was high treason punishable by hanging, drawing and quartering; to shelter a priest was a felony punishable by imprisonment, fines, confiscation of property and in many cases, death. It was only heroes and heroines who could face such ordeals – these are our martyrs, including our own Blessed John Ingram, the Gateshead martyr.

OUR LADY AND ST PHILIP NERI PARISH MASS WITH THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK will be celebrated at St Mary's Church, Whickham on Wednesday 28 August at 12 noon with refreshments afterwards in the Church Hall. The Sacrament of the Sick brings spiritual strength, comfort and support to those who are ill, facing surgery and indeed to all who are in need of the Lord's healing of mind, body or spirit.

Fr Peter, Eucharistic Ministers and the SVP regularly visit people who are ill, housebound or in hospital. However, by arranging this special celebration of Mass, we have the opportunity to welcome those who cannot easily leave their homes and who would not normally have the opportunity to come to Mass. So, it would be greatly appreciated if you would be prepared to provide transport for someone who would like to come.

LATEST UPDATE FROM BALAMMA SATRAM When Fr Sarves and Mary Skaag visited our parish recently, they were happy to be given such a warm welcome and to receive the commitment from Gift for Life to support their charity in the future. Mary outlined that the most recent concerns were based on the fact that there has been no rain for six years, causing catastrophic consequences - wells have dried up across an area as large as from Durham to Newcastle. Temperatures are currently 50 degrees and recent winds have blown away so many fragile homes in the region, although thankfully their complex is secure due to good foundations for the buildings. Balamma Satram provides accommodation for 150 people at any one time, namely the following groups in desperate need: the elderly, lepers, those disabled, the sick, victims of accidents; with additional support for others in dire need on occasion. Other groups of the poor who are widows or grandparents give help to the Balamma Satram community which enables their children/dependents to be educated. 54 are in education, 24 are handicapped and the remainder are the elderly. To assist in the longevity of the charity, it has paired with Carmelite Sisters in the province to ensure the continuation of the great work being carried out at Balamma Satram over the next 70 years. Fr Sarves and Mary have worked tirelessly to achieve this aim and offer Masses of Thanksgiving to all who support their mission.

JOHN INGRAM PRIEST AND MARTYR 1565 - 1594 In his new book, Fr Zielinski provides the background to the tempest of the Protestant Reformation in England and its impact on the spiritual, social and cultural dimensions of society, including on Tyneside, in order to situate the coming into the country of the seminary priests, such as John Ingram, who had trained abroad and who had to live hunted lives in Elizabethan England which had become a police state with an elaborate spynetwork. The book encourages the general reader to delve more deeply into the findings of Professor Eamon Duffy and Clare (Lady) Asquith, who argue for a more multi-dimensional reading of this period in English history, in contrast to the one-dimensional Protestant version of events in Tudor England. Some of John Ingram's letters and epigrams are included in the book, as well as a photocopy of his student entry and his signature in the Liber Ruba of the English College in Rome, courtesy of Professor Maurice Whitehead, the Schwarzenbach Research Fellow, acting as Archivist in the Archivum Venerabilis Collegii Anglorum de Urbe (The Venerable English College) in Rome.

Copies of the book (£5.99) are available in our three churches and at Pauline Books and Media, St Mary's Cathedral.
