SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD On the 30 September last year (the Feast of St Jerome), Pope Francis instituted a special day dedicated to celebrating the Word of God. In his Apostolic Letter entitled Aperuit illis ('He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures' Lk 24:45), Pope Francis declared the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time as the Sunday of the Word of God so this will be celebrated at Masses next weekend 25/26 January. The Holy Father writes 'Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the Word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world.' 

First Reading

The Lord said to me, 'You are my servant, Israel, in whom I shall be glorified'; I was honoured in the eyes of the Lord, my God was my strength. And now the Lord has spoken, he who formed me in the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob back to him, to gather Israel to him:

'It is not enough for you to be my servant, to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back the survivors of Israel; I will make you the light of the nations

so that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth.'

This is the one I spoke of when I said: A man is coming after me who ranks before me because he existed before me.
