

RE-OPENING OF CHURCHES FOR INDIVIDUAL PRAYERThe first five churches that have opened across the diocese are:

- **St. Mary's Cathedral, Newcastle upon Tyne:** Open daily from 1.00pm 4.00pm (including Saturday and Sunday) plus 9.30am 11.15am on Saturday and Sunday only.
- **St. Mary's Church, Sunderland:** Open from 10.00am to 1.00pm, Monday to Friday.
- **St. Aidan's Church, Ashington:** Open regularly from 1.00pm to 4.00pm on Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday. Last entry will be 3.30pm.
- **St. Patrick's Church, Consett:** Open Monday to Saturday 11.00am to 2.00pm and Sunday 2.00pm to 4.00pm.
- **St Joseph's, Church, Hartlepool**: Open Wednesday 11.00am to 12.30pm and Sunday 11.00am to 12.30pm and 4.00pm to 5.30pm.

Please note, before any of our churches can be re-opened, the following points should be borne in mind:

- The safety of parishioners, volunteers, staff and clergy is to be of the highest priority.
- As indicated, a very small number of churches will be opened first. The Bishop, in consultation with his Episcopal Council and Partnership Deans, will decide which other churches will subsequently reopen and when.
- Before any church re-opens, a full risk assessment will be carried out on each church by the Diocese to ensure health and safety protocols are in place.
- The Diocese will provide the necessary equipment for a deep clean of the churches and for essential regular cleaning.
- Volunteers will be needed for church cleaning and as stewards to ensure social distancing when the church is open.
- Full compliance with Diocesan health and safety regulations and procedures will be required by clergy, employees and volunteers before a church is re-opened.

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 12:1-11

King Herod started persecuting certain members of the Church. He beheaded James the brother of John, and when he saw that this pleased the Jews he decided to arrest Peter as well. This was during the days of Unleavened Bread, and he put Peter in prison, assigning four squads of four soldiers each to guard him in turns. Herod meant to try Peter in public after the end of Passover week. All the time Peter was under guard the Church prayed to God for him unremittingly.

On the night before Herod was to try him, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, fastened with double chains, while guards kept watch at the main entrance to the prison. Then suddenly the angel of the Lord stood there, and the cell was filled with light. He tapped Peter on the side and woke him. 'Get up!' he said 'Hurry!' – and the chains fell from his hands. The angel then said, 'Put on your belt and sandals.' After he had done this, the angel next said, 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me.' Peter followed him, but had no idea that what the angel did was all happening in reality; he thought he was seeing a vision. They passed through two guard posts one after the other, and reached the iron gate leading to the city. This opened of its own accord; they went through it and had walked the whole length of one street when suddenly the angel left him. It was only then that Peter came to himself. 'Now I know it is all true,' he said. 'The Lord really did send his angel and has saved me from Herod and from all that the Jewish people were so certain would happen to me.'

Spiritual Communion There are times when people are unable to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, such as during this present time of the Covid-19 pandemic. Even though some may not receive 'sacramental' Communion, all are united in some way by the Holy Spirit. The traditional idea of 'spiritual' Communion is an important one to remember and reaffirm. A deep spiritual communion is possible even when we do not share together the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ. Please say this prayer of Spiritual Communion (based on a prayer of St Alphonsus Liquori):

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen.
