



PUBLIC CELEBRATION OF MASS AT IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY CHURCH If you would like to attend Mass at Immaculate Heart Church, please see **** below about 'booking in'**.

Forthcoming Masses:

Tuesday 27 October - Church will open at 6.00pm for 6.30pm Mass.

Sunday 1 November (All Saints) - Church will open at 9.30am for 10.00am Mass.

Monday 2 November (All Souls) - Church will open at 9.30am for 10.00am Mass.

Tuesday 3 November - Church will open at 6.00pm for 6.30pm Mass.

When you come to church, please maintain social distancing (2 metres). A one-way system is in place, plus hand sanitisers at the entrance (Main Doors) and exit (Day Chapel). You are also required to wear a face covering. Once in church please be guided by the volunteer stewards. The number of parishioners who can safely attend each Mass is 42 plus - we have the flexibility of 'plus' because members of the same household or support bubble may sit together.

****IMPORTANT In order to ensure that all those attending Mass have a seat and can be safely accommodated inside the church, we have introducing a dedicated telephone 'booking in' system - the telephone number is 07388 814715 and you will be able to contact this number Monday - Wednesday, 11am - 6pm. To maintain a fair system, you are asked to book your place in advance on a weekly basis via this telephone number. Please be advised that unfortunately, this number does not accept text messaging.**

When booking you will be asked for the date of the Mass you wish to attend, your name, telephone number and the number in your party. For test and trace purposes, these details will be retained for 21 days, then securely destroyed. When you come into church, you will see a poster on display with Immaculate Heart's QR code. This can be scanned using the NHS COVID-19 App if you have downloaded it onto your mobile phone. Please feel free to scan this code but note contact details will also still be requested, manually noted and safely stored for 21 days.

RED MISSION BOXES We are unable to empty red mission boxes at present either in homes or at church. If you wish you can put the contents of your box into a labelled envelope and place it in the collection basket if you are coming to Immaculate Heart Church for Mass.

THE PARISH HALF-YEARLY FINANCIAL RETURNS for the six months April - September 2020 are now completed and it is pleasing to report that total funds have increased from £286,096 to £293,558. Of this figure £290,682 belongs to the Parish with £2,618 being held for *Gift for Life* and £258 for special collections. Not surprisingly, offertory collections of £18,486 are some 42% down on last year's figure of £32,395 as we suffer from the effects of Covid-19 and the closure of the churches.

However, the impact is not as severe as it would have been a few years ago when all offertory monies were collected in the form of cash and we are grateful to those parishioners who have recently switched their contributions to bank transfer. Perhaps now is the time for even more to make their contributions via this method. If you would like to set up a standing order for your regular contributions, or to make a one-off contribution, please make arrangements with your bank. Reference for standing orders: insert your own name; commencing: e.g. 6th of each month; frequency: each month, quarterly or annually. Alternatively, if you have Planned Giving envelopes or *Gift for Life* envelopes you can always put them through the letterbox at Immaculate Heart Presbytery or bring them with you if you are coming to Immaculate Heart Church for Mass or to drop off items for the Food Appeal.

To help mitigate against the decline in income the Diocese has temporarily stopped charging the quarterly levy and we are also seeing savings in repairs, utilities and church requisites. So, all in all we remain in a reasonably strong position and should be thankful that past and present prudence means we are in better financial shape than many other less fortunate parishes. Thank you.

OCTOBER - THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY Rosary Whirlwind British Isles is taking place throughout October with a nightly online Rosary at 8pm led from a different Marian Shrine, Cathedral or Parish - our parish is now shown on the map! We are part of a group of 2 to 300 people saying rosary at home at 8pm each night. The power behind such prayer is amazing! FOOD APPEAL UPDATE We are only able to continue this worthwhile outreach because of your amazing generosity. Unfortunately, as the R number increases and new restrictions are again impacting upon the future of people's jobs, it is even more important that we can continue and maintain this support - you are all stars, thank you!

We are running out of the following items - milk, tinned custard, fruit, potatoes, sweetcorn, carrots, peas, tuna, cooking sauces, crisps, kitchen rolls, feminine hygiene & washing (laundry) powder. Any other items such as - long grain rice, tinned tomatoes, meat, soup, deodorant, biscuits etc gratefully received. Please note currently we have plenty pasta and cereal.

The organisation and arrangement for packing and distribution of food have now altered because it is very important that as local and national Covid-19 restrictions increase we don't mix with others. **However, the arrangements remain the same for Thursdays - someone will be at the church between 10 - 10.30am so parishioners can still drop donations off at church if they wish.** If you are dropping off donations at church, please don't enter the church but give a shout and leave any donations inside the open door.

Spiritual Communion *There are times when people are unable to receive the Body and Blood of Christ, such as during this present time of the Covid-19 pandemic. Even though some may not receive 'sacramental' Communion, all are united in some way by the Holy Spirit. The traditional idea of 'spiritual' Communion is an important one to remember and reaffirm. A deep spiritual communion is possible even when we do not share together the Sacrament of the Body and Blood of Christ. Please say this prayer of Spiritual Communion (based on a prayer of St Alphonsus Liguori):*

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Holy Sacrament of the altar. I love you above all things and I passionately desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my soul so that I may unite myself wholly to you now and forever. Amen.
