

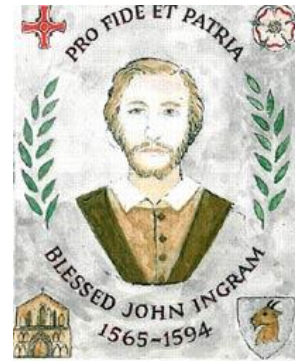

NATIONAL LOCKDOWN IN ENGLAND From Thursday 5 November - Wednesday 2 December, Catholic churches will only be permitted to allow people to enter for private individual prayer and funerals.

Whilst there is no public celebration of Mass, Immaculate Heart of Mary Church will be open for individual prayer on Sundays throughout November, 10am - 11am. N.B. you do not need to 'book in' for this.

For those attending for individual prayer, the wearing of a face covering is mandatory unless a person has an exemption from this. When travelling to church, please observe strict social distancing from anyone not in your household and when you come into church, please maintain social distancing (2 metres). A one-way system is in place, plus hand sanitisers at the entrance (Main Doors) and exit (Day Chapel). Once in church please be guided by the volunteer stewards. Also, you will see a poster on display with Immaculate Heart's QR code which can be scanned using the NHS COVID-19 App if you have downloaded it onto your mobile phone. Please feel free to scan this code but note contact details will also still be requested, manually noted and safely stored for 21 days.

PROPOSED CHRISTMAS MASSES AT IMMACULATE HEART CHURCH Government regulations permitting, we are planning to have two Parish Christmas Masses at Immaculate Heart Church - 7.00pm on Christmas Eve 24 December and 9.30am on Christmas Day 25 December. **Booking in for either of these Masses is essential.** To gauge how many parishioners will want to attend these Masses and how we can safely accommodate numbers, booking will commence this Monday 23 November. To 'book in' please ring 07388 814715, Monday - Wednesday, 11am - 6pm. Please be advised this number does not accept text messaging. When booking in, you will be asked for the date of the Mass you wish to attend, your name, telephone number and the number in your party. For test and trace purposes, these details will be retained for 21 days, then securely destroyed. Please note there will also be Christmas Mass available on our YouTube channel.

RED MISSION BOXES We are unable to empty red mission boxes at present either in homes or at church. If you wish you can put the contents of your box into a labelled envelope and place it in the collection basket if you are coming to Immaculate Heart Church for individual prayer. Thank you.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left. 'Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me." 'Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me."
