SUNDAY MORNING 10.00am MASS

In order to ensure that all those coming to church can have a seat and be safely accommodated, there is a dedicated telephone 'booking in' system - the telephone number is 07388 814715 and you can contact this number Monday - Wednesday, 11am - 6pm. Please note this number does not accept text messaging and there is no facility to leave a message.

For those who have booked-in and are attending Mass, the church will open half an hour before the published Mass time.

The wearing of a face covering is mandatory unless a person has an exemption from this. At all times, when travelling to and from church, and whilst in church, you must observe strict social distancing (i.e. 2 metres) from anyone not in your household or support bubble and you must not mingle with anyone not in your household or support bubble before, during or after Mass.

A one-way system is in place in the church, plus hand sanitisers at the entrance (Main Doors) and exit (Day Chapel). Once in church, please be guided by the volunteer stewards.

There is also a poster on display with Immaculate Heart's QR code which can be scanned using the NHS COVID-19 app if you have downloaded it onto your mobile phone. Contact details will also still be requested, manually noted and safely stored for 21 days.

BLESSED JOHN INGRAM Blessed John Ingram (1565 - 1594) was a Reformation martyr who was executed on Gateshead High Street for ministering to the faithful of this region. During his ministry, he was assisted and sheltered by local aristocrats, but was eventually apprehended and convicted on a charge of high treason. A MARATHON OF PRAYER 2021 The Diocese of Hexham & Newcastle welcomes Pope Francis' invitation to encourage the Universal Church to pray the Rosary during May. At the heart of the Holy Father's wish, the month of May will be dedicated to a marathon of prayer from the theme "From the whole Church the prayer to God went up incessantly" (Acts 12:5). The initiative will involve in a special way all the Sanctuaries of the world, so that they become promoters to the faithful, families and communities of the recitation of the Rosary to invoke the end of the pandemic. CELEBRATION OF MARRIAGE Bishop Robert will preside at a Celebration of Marriage and Family Life Mass in the Cathedral next Saturday 22 May 2021 at 12 noon. This will be both an open Mass and live streamed. The invitation will focus on couples celebrating significant anniversaries in 2021 but is open to engaged couples preparing for marriage, those who were married in the months prior to lockdown and since our last Mass in 2019 and all married couples. We include too those widowed and bereaved who were unable to visit wives and husbands in hospital and homes prior to their deaths. In these unprecedented times we remember couples in crisis and individual adults and children experiencing difficulties and abuse in their family relationships. We wish all to know that none is forgotten and that the Sacramental life, despite Covid, is very much alive and prayed for. We will live stream the Mass as we recognise that many may feel uneasy about attending in person and for all others who may exceed the limit.


FAITH WITNESS AGAINST HASSOCKFIELD In October this year, the UK Government plans to open an Immigration Removal Centre at Hassockfield on the site of the former Medomsley Detention Centre, nr Consett. This will be for 80 women seeking asylum in the UK. Along with many other organisations, our Diocesan Justice and Peace Co-ordinating Council has condemned this proposal as inhumane and unjust. Migrant women are not criminals and deserve our utmost respect, protection and compassion as they make their case for asylum. An Interfaith Prayer Service will take place on **Sunday 23 May at 3.00pm** in several churches and places of worship across the region as part of a united faith response against Hassockfield. The Youth Ministry Team (YMT) will join with the Faith Witness and will go live at the same time on YMT's Facebook which can be accessed <u>here</u>.

Liturgy of the Word

Seventh Sunday of Easter

Acts of the Apostles 1:15-17. 20-26

One day Peter stood up to speak to the brothers – there were about a hundred and twenty persons in the congregation: 'Brothers, the passage of scripture had to be fulfilled in which the Holy Spirit, speaking through David, foretells the fate of Judas, who offered himself as a guide to the men who arrested Jesus – after having been one of our number and actually sharing this ministry of ours.

'In the Book of Psalms it says:

Let someone else take his office.

'We must therefore choose someone who has been with us the whole time that the Lord Jesus was travelling around with us, someone who was with us right from the time when John was baptising until the day when he was taken up from us – and he can act with us as a witness to his resurrection.'

Having nominated two candidates, Joseph known as Barsabbas, whose surname was Justus, and Matthias, they prayed, 'Lord, you can read everyone's heart; show us therefore which of these two you have chosen to take over this ministry and apostolate, which Judas abandoned to go to his proper place.' They then drew lots for them, and as the lot fell to Matthias, he was listed as one of the twelve apostles.
