SUNDAY MORNING 10.00am MASS

In order to ensure that all those coming to church can have a seat and be safely accommodated, there is a dedicated telephone 'booking in' system - the telephone number is 07388 814715 and you can contact this number Monday - Wednesday, 11am - 6pm. Please note this number does not accept text messaging and there is no facility to leave a message.

For those who have booked-in and are attending Mass, the church will open half an hour before the published Mass time.

The wearing of a face covering is mandatory unless a person has an exemption from this. At all times, when travelling to and from church, and whilst in church, you must observe strict social distancing (i.e. 2 metres) from anyone not in your household or support bubble and you must not mingle with anyone not in your household or support bubble before, during or after Mass.

A one-way system is in place in the church, plus hand sanitisers at the entrance (Main Doors) and exit (Day Chapel). Once in church, please be guided by the volunteer stewards.

There is also a poster on display with Immaculate Heart's QR code which can be scanned using the NHS COVID-19 app if you have downloaded it onto your mobile phone. Contact details will also still be requested, manually noted and safely stored for 21 days.

PARISH FINANCES 2020-2021 The annual financial returns for the year ended March 2021 have been completed and it is pleasing to report that total funds have increased from £286,096 to £303,354. Of this figure, £295,236 belongs to the Parish with other monies being held for Gift for Life, the Food Bank and special collections that are paid after year end closes. The £17,069 increase in parish money compares to a £26,828 increase last year. The £9,798 decrease is mainly attributable to a £21,776 (27.6%) decline in offertory collections which is due of course to the church closures during the whole year. Given the circumstances, this is quite an impressive performance and the impact has been reduced somewhat by lower spending in areas such as heating, repairs and church requisites.

We are in a more fortunate position then we would have been a few years ago when all offertory monies were collected in the form of cash. In any event, grateful thanks to all parishioners who continue to contribute financially by standing order (including those who have switched to this method over the past 12 months) and those who contribute to the weekly church collections or post their offertory envelopes through the presbytery letter box. Looking to the this financial year, both the PPC and Finance Committee have approved a contribution of £6,000 towards the cost of a new kitchen at <u>Joe's Place</u> which supports some of the most needy and vulnerable people in the area. Other parishes in the Partnership have also contributed to the refurbishments at <u>Joe's Place</u>. THE DAY OF PRAYER FOR HUMAN LIFE is next Sunday 20 June. This is the day in the Church's Year dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition, remembering that the Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. A special collection will be taken at Mass next Sunday to support pro-life organisations which raise awareness, engage in parliamentary work and pastoral outreach. CAUSE FOR THE CANONISATION OF BLESSED JOHN INGRAM

During his ministry, he was assisted and sheltered by local aristocrats, but was eventually apprehended and convicted on a charge of high treason. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
