FOOD DONATIONS FOR THE FOOD BANK & REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE + *SPECIAL UKRAINIAN APPEAL*

This week we would like to make a special appeal on top of our usual request for food donations for our Food Bank - I'm sure by now you know the kind of perishable items we use.

There has been a Diocesan wide appeal requesting a collection of goods for Ukraine across all parishes within the Diocese of Hexham and Newcastle. This is in response to an appeal for help from Ukraine and Poland and the Polish Centre in Newcastle is organising a collection of new, unused goods.

<u>Personal hygiene products</u>: soaps, shower gels, shampoos and hair conditioners, hairbrushes, toothbrushes and toothpaste, for children and adults, antiperspirants and deodorants (mainly for women but also for men), face creams and tonics, hand creams for women, sanitary towels, tampons, panty liners, larger sanitary pads for women in puerperium and nursing pads (breast feeding pads), wet wipes, nappies of various sizes, tissues, cotton pads.

<u>Medical supplies</u>: first aid kits, bandages, gauze and swabs, tourniquets, plasters, disposable gloves, painkillers, anti-fever and anti-inflammatory drugs for children and adults, vitamins for children, cough medicines, sore throat relieves, stomach problems remedies, nasal drops.

For children, to keep them occupied and distracted, to make them smile: colouring books and crayons/markers, small puzzles, small soft toys/cuddly toys, sweets: chocolates, bars, snacks, etc.

<u>And also</u>: baby porridge, baby rice, fruit/vegetable snacks in tubes (not jars) instant foods such as soups, etc., long-term foods such as canned food, etc., paper towels, cutlery and disposable plates, sleeping bags, mats, blankets, power banks, batteries, flashlights.

Arrangements will be made to deliver any items we receive in our churches to the Polish Centre in Newcastle - 2 Maple Terrace, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE4 7SF. They are accepting deliveries until 13 March 2022. You can, if you wish, also make these deliveries in person with prior arrangement - please contact Mr Wojciech Ploszaj, phone number 07549 530775.

The displaced Ukrainian people will be very grateful for your empathy, understanding and Christian outreach - please support this collection for those in desperate need.

OUTREACH HOUSING GATESHEAD Just over a year ago, Outreach Housing was born after some of our Outreach Group attended a webinar presentation given by Green Pastures,

(www.greenpastures.net), a national Christian charity that seeks to end homelessness. We recognised that an urgent need in Gateshead was to provide a home for new refugees who have recently received right to remain and to offer them support until they are ready to take the next step in settling and creating a new life in the UK. In October, our Diocese became a partner of Green Pastures and in December the charity bought a house in Bensham for us to lease and to turn into a home for three refugees.

We are grateful to all those who have supported us in so many ways. Please keep this project and especially our first residents in your prayers. This is an exciting but very new venture and we can only do this if we work and pray together as a community. Thank you especially to those who volunteered to clean the house last Tuesday and to those who cleared the small front garden and backyard. We are also grateful for the donations we have received of a fridge freezer and washing machine, furniture, curtains and kitchen equipment.

The project has, however, incurred a number of expenses including the installation of a new boiler at a cost of £2100. We are appealing for donations to cover this cost and the cost of various smaller items as we fit out the house with necessary furnishings and equipment. For example we need to purchase stepladders, iron and ironing board, doormat etc.

We have also been strongly advised by Green Pastures to set up a contingency fund for future repairs and expenses as we go forward. If you would like to donate to this fund, there are a number of options:

Liturgy of the Word

First Sunday of Lent

First Reading

Deuteronomy 26:4-10

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement:

"My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians illtreated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God.'
