RETURNING TO MASS AT PENTECOST An invitation from the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales to 'Return to Mass at Pentecost' was approved on Friday 6 May 2022. This means that the obligation for Catholics to attend Mass on Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation will be re-introduced from the Feast of Pentecost which we celebrate on Sunday 5 June. The bishops have said they understood that "there will still be some members of our congregations who, for reasons of health, do not feel safe enough to return to Mass.... It has always been the understanding of the Church that when the freedom of any Catholic to attend Mass in person is impeded for a serious reason, because of situations such as ill health, care for the sick or legitimate fear, this is not a breach of the Sunday Obligation." The bishops also state that whilst "virtual viewing" of Mass over the internet does not fulfil the obligation to go to Mass on Sunday or Holy Days of Obligation, "it may, however, be a source of continual spiritual comfort to those who cannot attend Mass in person, for example those who are elderly and sick, for whom the obligation does not apply." Current Diocesan COVID Controls

Until further notice, arrangements for our three churches will be as follows:

tinned meat (corned beef, pek, spam), hot dogs, meatballs, chopped tomatoes, fruit, soup, baked beans, custard, rice pudding, soup, kidney beans, chickpeas, all vegetables, potatoes & tuna, UHT milk, crisps, biscuits, tomato purée, antiperspirant, toothpaste & toilet roll.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags:

cooking oil, pasta sauce, sugar, long grain rice, jam, coffee, tea, shower gel, shampoo laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (tampons) & all other non-perishable items.

PARISH FINANCIAL STATEMENT The parish annual returns for the Financial Year ended March 2022 have been completed and we are pleased to report that total funds have increased slightly from £303,354 to £305,876 and include balances held on our Parish Current account, St Mary's Hall Current account and our Parish Deposit account held centrally with the Diocese. Of this figure £292,757 belongs to the Parish with the sums of £7,758 and £5,361 being held on behalf of Gift for Life and the Foodbank projects. Offertory collections of £50,873 are 18.5% higher than last year as our churches opened again after lockdown but the Gift Aid claim of £8,511 is 36% down as it relates to the 2020/21 Financial Year when the churches were closed or attendance was restricted during that Financial Year. With the gradual return to normality it is only to be expected that we have seen increases in utility costs, repairs, staff wages, church requisites and general administration fees while our contribution to the Diocese in the form of a levy on income increased from £12,811 to £13,148.

Significant donations made by the parish during the year were $\pounds 6,000$ to Joe's Place (St Joseph's, Gateshead) towards the cost of a new kitchen and $\pounds 3,000$ to Outreach Housing to help fund the purchase of a property in Gateshead to accommodate refugees.

It is worth noting that we are in a more fortunate position than we would have been a few years ago when all offertories were collected via the church plate. The move to standing orders by many parishioners has certainly helped the parish through the uncertainty of the past 2 years and we thank you all for your continued financial support.

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the heard of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome – Jews and proselytes alike – Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'
