<u>Priority items</u>: cooking oil, sweets, tinned meat (corned beef, pek, spam), hot dogs, meatballs, chopped tomatoes, fruit, soup, baked beans, custard, rice pudding, all vegetables, potatoes, sugar, long grain rice, UHT milk, squash, crisps, biscuits, tomato purée & toilet roll.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (tampons), shower gel, shampoo, antiperspirant, toothpaste, tinned kidney beans, chickpeas, pasta, pasta sauce, jam, coffee, tea, tuna & all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday volunteers are in church between 9.30 - 10.30am so parishioners can drop donations off here if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.

As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My Lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.'

Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it.
