Current Diocesan COVID Controls

Until further notice, arrangements for our three churches will be as follows:

- If you are displaying any symptoms of Covid-19 you should stay at home and not travel to church or participate in person
- Stewards will continue for the time being
- Hand sanitiser will continue to be offered as you enter and leave church
- Face coverings - those who wish to wear a face covering may do so during the celebration of Mass
- Social Distancing - there is no requirement for social distancing but we should continue to be sensitive to the wishes of other people
- Ventilation – it is still important to ventilate our buildings. This has the effect of diluting and dispersing viral particles
- Holy Communion will continue to be distributed under one kind

We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out.

Priority items: UHT milk, cooking oil, dried pasta, pasta sauce, tinned rice pudding, custard, sweetcorn, long grain rice, squash & shampoo.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (tampons & pads), shower gel, antiperspirant, toothpaste, toilet roll, tinned kidney beans, chickpeas, jam, coffee, tinned meat (corned beef, pek, spam), hot dogs, meatballs, tuna, soup, baked beans, fruit, custard, rice pudding, all vegetables, potatoes, sugar, sweets, crisps, biscuits, tomato purée & all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday volunteers are in church between 9.30 - 10.30am so parishioners can drop donations off here if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.

Prayer of St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (1891 - 1942)

O Prince of Peace, to all who receive You, You bright light and peace. Help me to live in daily contact with You, listening to the words You have spoken and obeying them. O Divine Child, I place my hands in Yours; I shall follow You. Oh, let Your divine life flow into me.

I will go unto the altar of God. It is not myself and my tiny little affairs that matter here,

but the great sacrifice of atonement. I surrender myself entirely to Your divine will, O Lord. Make my heart grow greater and wider, out of itself into the Divine Life.

O my God, fill my soul with holy joy, courage and strength to serve You. Enkindle Your love in me and then walk with me along the next stretch of road before me. I do not see very far ahead, but when I have arrived where the horizon now closes down, a new prospect will open before me and I shall meet with peace.

How wondrous are the marvels of your love.

We are amazed, we stammer and grow dumb, for word and spirit fail us.

The Feast of St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) is celebrated on Tuesday 9 August. She was born into a practising Jewish family and converted to Catholicism in 1922 having read St Teresa of Avila's autobiography. She subsequently became a Discalced Carmelite nun. She was arrested by the Nazis as a Jewish convert to Christianity and was executed at Auschwitz Concentration Camp on 9 August 1942.

That night had been foretold to our ancestors, so that, once they saw what kind of oaths they had put their trust in they would joyfully take courage. This was the expectation of your people, the saving of the virtuous and the ruin of their enemies; for by the same act with which you took vengeance on our foes you made us glorious by calling us to you. The devout children of worthy men offered sacrifice in secret and this divine pact they struck with one accord: that the saints would share the same blessings and dangers alike; and forthwith they had begun to chant the hymns of the fathers.

Only faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for, or prove the existence of the realities that at present remain unseen. It was for faith that our ancestors were commended. It was by faith that Abraham obeyed the call to set out for a country that was the inheritance given to him and his descendants, and that he set out without knowing where he was going. By faith he arrived, as a foreigner, in the Promised Land, and lived there as if in a strange country, with Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. They lived there in tents while he looked forward to a city founded, designed and built by God. It was equally by faith that Sarah, in spite of being past the age, was made able to conceive, because she believed that he who had made the promise would be faithful to it. Because of this, there came from one man, and one who was already as good as dead himself, more descendants than could be counted, as many as the stars of heaven or the grains of sand on the seashore.
