We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out

<u>Priority items:</u> cereal, UHT milk, tomato purée, tinned meat (corned beef, pek, spam), pasta sauce, tinned fruit, rice pudding, custard, sweetcorn, soup & jam, antiperspirant.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: long grain rice, squash, dried pasta, cooking oil, tinned kidney beans, chickpeas, coffee, hot dogs, meatballs, tuna, baked beans, custard, rice pudding, all vegetables, potatoes, sugar, sweets, crisps, biscuits, toothpaste, shower gel, shampoo, toilet roll, laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (tampons & pads) and all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday volunteers are in church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop donations off here if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you.
