

We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out.

<u>Priority items:</u> tinned meat (corned beef, pek, spam), tinned chickpeas, kidney beans, fruit, custard, sweetcorn, soup, jam, UHT milk, cereal, laundry powder/liquid & antiperspirant, feminine hygiene (tampons especially).

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: long grain rice, squash, dried pasta, pasta sauce, cooking oil, coffee, tinned produce (hot dogs, meatballs, tuna, baked beans, custard, rice pudding, all vegetables & potatoes), sugar, tomato purée, sweets, crisps, biscuits, shampoo, shower gel, toothpaste, toilet roll & all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday volunteers are in church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop donations off here if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.

On a sabbath day Jesus had gone for a meal to the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely. He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'
