<u>Priority items - VERY SHORT SUPPLY</u>: tinned meat (corned beef, pek, spam), UHT milk, & feminine hygiene (tampons especially). <u>OTHER priority items</u>: crisps, pasta, biscuits, cooking oil, crisps, tinned tuna, meatballs, fruit, all vegetables (sweetcorn, garden peas, carrots), custard, jam, laundry powder/liquid, washing up liquid, toilet roll.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: antiperspirant, toothpaste, long grain rice, squash, shampoo, shower gel, pasta sauce, coffee, tinned produce (hot dogs, baked beans, rice pudding, all & potatoes), sugar, tomato purée, & all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday volunteers are in church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop donations off here if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.

I am sending him back to you, and with him - I could say - a part of my own self. I should have liked to keep him with me; he could have been a substitute for you, to help me while I am in the chains that the Good News has brought me. However, I did not want to do anything without your consent; it would have been forcing your act of kindness, which should be spontaneous.

I know you have been deprived of Onesimus for a time, but it was only so that you could have him back for ever, not as a slave any more, but something much better than a slave, a dear brother; especially dear to me, but how much more to you, as a blood-brother as well as a brother in the Lord. So if all that we have in common means anything to you, welcome him as you would me.
