PARISH HALF-YEAR FINANCIAL REPORT The finance report for the half-year ended September has been completed and it is encouraging to report that total funds have increased from £305,876 to £322,693. Of this figure, £307,356 belongs to the Parish with the remaining £15,337 being held on behalf of the Gift for Life, the Parish Foodbank and the Diocese. Offertory collections for the 6 months of £27,448 compare to £23,279 (+18%) for last year and £18,486 for 2020 (+48%) but are still 15.3% behind the pre-Covid £32,394 of 2019. The gradual improvement in offertory collections since the beginning of the pandemic is very welcome as we are starting to incur significant increases on our utility bills for each of our three churches, St Mary's Hall and Immaculate Heart Presbytery. The next few months will see major investment on the Dockendale Cottage roof and St Mary's church entrance while the boiler in Immaculate Heart presbytery has also recently been replaced. In total we can expect this spend to be in excess of £30,000 with the likely consequence of the half year surplus being eroded and there being a full year deficit by March 2023. Fortunately, we are in a relatively healthy financial position so we can hopefully absorb these essential repairs and still continue with our commitment to our parish mission and maintenance responsibilities. Thank you for your ongoing generosity which is much appreciated.

Items we put into the weekly food bags: all tinned vegetables (including potatoes), tuna, chopped tomatoes, meatballs, hotdogs, custard, rice, cereal, plus dried pasta, biscuits, squash, gravy granules, ketchup, mayonnaise, coffee, sugar, toothpaste, feminine hygiene, antiperspirant, shampoo, shower gel, washing up liquid, plus all other non-perishable items.

This Thursday 3 November, volunteers will be in church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop off donations then if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.

THE LINDISFARNE GOSPELS The Lindisfarne Gospels are currently on display at the Laing Art Gallery until 3 December 2022, on loan from the <u>British Library</u>.

The Lindisfarne Gospels has long been acclaimed as the most spectacular manuscript to survive from Anglo-Saxon England. It is a copy of the four Gospels, the biblical books recounting the life of Christ, along with the associated texts that typically form part of Gospel-books, such as chapter lists and letters written by St Jerome (d. 420).

The Lindisfarne Gospels will feature in a contemporary exhibition about its meaning in the world today and its relationship with themes of personal, regional and national identity.

Created on the Holy Island of Lindisfarne, the book represents the golden age of design and craftsmanship in Northumbria and has survived in almost perfect condition for over one thousand years.

The Lindisfarne Gospels will be accompanied by an exhibition about its meaning in the world today and exploring its relationship with themes of personal, regional and national identity in the Laing Art Gallery itself. The exhibition includes an immersive digital experience and includes a selection of early medieval treasures brought together from across the UK, while there is a new film by Turner Prize winning artist Jeremy Deller.

There is a programme of events throughout the North East to accompany the Gospels' time in the region with events in Durham, Northumberland, Sunderland and South Tyneside, and of course at the place the books were produced: The Holy Island of Lindisfarne.
