FOOD DONATIONS FOR THE FOOD BANK & REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE Please note if you're not able to or would rather not shop for the Food Bank we're happy to accept a cash donation to shop on your behalf.

PRIORITY ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY - tinned rice, custard, peas, sweetcorn, carrots, chopped tomatoes, potatoes, meat, dried pasta, UHT milk & laundry powder/liquid.

OTHER priority items - tinned hot dogs, fruit, crisps, long grain rice, cooking oil, toothpaste & antiperspirant.

Items we put into the weekly food bags: pasta sauce, meatballs, custard, rice, plus dried pasta, squash, , shower gel, washing up liquid, gravy granules, ketchup, mayonnaise, tomato purée, teabags, coffee, sugar, biscuits, shampoo, feminine hygiene plus all other non-perishable items.

PARISH HALF-YEAR FINANCIAL REPORT The finance report for the half-year ended September has been completed and it is encouraging to report that total funds have increased from £305,876 to £322,693. Of this figure, £307,356 belongs to the Parish with the remaining £15,337 being held on behalf of the Gift for Life, the Parish Foodbank and the Diocese. Offertory collections for the 6 months of £27,448 compare to £23,279 (+18%) for last year and £18,486 for 2020 (+48%) but are still 15.3% behind the pre-Covid £32,394 of 2019. The gradual improvement in offertory collections since the beginning of the pandemic is very welcome as we are starting to incur significant increases on our utility bills for each of our three churches, St Mary's Hall and Immaculate Heart Presbytery. The next few months will see major investment on the Dockendale Cottage roof and St Mary's church entrance while the boiler in Immaculate Heart presbytery has also recently been replaced. In total we can expect this spend to be in excess of £30,000 with the likely consequence of the half year surplus being eroded and there being a full year deficit by March 2023. Fortunately, we are in a relatively healthy financial position so we can hopefully absorb these essential repairs and still continue with our commitment to our parish mission and maintenance responsibilities. Thank you for your ongoing generosity which is much appreciated.

II Maccabees 7:1-2. 9-14

There were seven brothers who were arrested with their mother. The king tried to force them to taste pig's flesh, which the Law forbids, by torturing them with whips and scourges. One of them, acting as spokesman for the others, said, 'What are you trying to find out from us? We are prepared to die rather than break the Law of our ancestors.'

With his last breath the second brother exclaimed, 'Inhuman fiend, you may discharge us from this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up, since it is for his laws that we die, to live again for ever.'

After him, they amused themselves with the third, who on being asked for his tongue promptly thrust it out and boldly held out his hands, with these honourable words, 'It was heaven that gave me these limbs; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again.' The king and his attendants were astounded at the young man's courage and his utter indifference to suffering.

When this one was dead they subjected the fourth to the same savage torture. When he neared his end he cried, 'Ours is the better choice, to meet death at men's hands, yet relying on God's promise that we shall be raised up by him; whereas for you there can be no resurrection, no new life.'

Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all men are in fact alive.'
