We have been assured that this is not an onerous or time taking task. Ideally, two guardians are required for contact purposes. John Hebron has offered to be one of these, therefore ideally it would be great to have a second guardian who attends Immaculate Heart of Mary Church. An awareness session about the use of the defibrillator is to be arranged for everyone who is interested in the National Defibrillator Network. No medical knowledge is required!
