RESIGNATION OF BISHOP ROBERT On Monday 12 December, Bishop Robert's resignation as Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle was announced at St Mary's Cathedral. Archbishop Malcolm McMahon, Archbishop of Liverpool and Metropolitan of the Northern Province of Dioceses, made the announcement and read a letter from Bishop Robert which will also be read at Masses this weekend and can be viewed on the diocesan website. Archbishop Malcolm has been appointed Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese by the Holy See and he will have episcopal oversight of the Diocese until a successor to Bishop Robert is appointed.
