PEACE SUNDAY This Sunday, 15 January, is PEACE SUNDAY and this year the message from Pope Francis tells us: 'No one can be saved alone. Combatting Covid-19 together, embarking together on paths of peace'. He asks us: 'What did we learn from the pandemic? What new paths should we follow to cast off the shackles of our old habits, to be better prepared, to dare new things? What signs of life and hope can we see, to help us move forward and try to make our world a better place?' A vaccine has been found for Covid-19, says the Holy Father, but we still need to tackle the virus of war, and of inequality, and this can only be done together. In this country we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi, which aims at working together to promote peace through parishes, schools and social media. Their website suggests ways we can all become better peacemakers. PRIORITY ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: tinned meat, meatballs, toothpaste, shampoo, toilet roll, anti-perspiration, sanitary protection.

OTHER priority items: tinned rice, custard, fruit, tuna, sweets, potatoes, crisps, ketchup, mayonnaise, dilute fruit juice, cleaning spray. Items we put into the weekly food bags: tinned peas, sweetcorn, carrots, dried pasta, pasta sauce, teabags, coffee, sugar, biscuits, cooking oil, antiperspirant, feminine hygiene, laundry powder/liquid, washing up liquid plus all other non-perishable items.
