

PARISH FINANCES The Parish Financial Report for the 9 months to December has been prepared with parish funds standing at £289,607. This includes a total of £15,410 being held on behalf of Gift for Life, Foodbank and Special Collections. Parish funds have declined by £3,150 since the start of April 2022.

Offertory Collections of £41,713 are +10% on the same period in 2021 and +35% on 2020 but 16.5% down on the near £50,000 received in 2019.

We have also received £10,000 in the form of will legacies from two deceased parishioners for which we are especially grateful.

Expenditure on major repairs has started to accelerate with a total of nearly £40,000 spent to date on among other items St Mary's Church frontage, a new boiler at Immaculate Heart presbytery and the gas main excavation and installation works currently underway at St Mary's.

Upcoming costs include the installation of a new gas boilers for St Mary's Church and Presbytery estimated at £36,000 and repairs to Dockendale Cottage roof of £18,000.

Still to be considered and finalised are the proposed replacement of St Philip Neri's roof and the heaters at Immaculate Heart Church. After a relatively quiet few years of major building spend we are in the middle of a period of significant investment which will erode the parish funds.

However, it is worth remembering that when the single parish was formed in 2018 our funds stood at £230,000 so we are still nearly £60,000 better off now compared to then and in a healthier financial position than many other parishes.

Once again, thank you for your ongoing generosity which is much appreciated.

PRIORITY ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: tinned meat, meatballs, toothpaste, shampoo, toilet roll, anti-perspiration, sanitary protection.

OTHER priority items: tinned rice, custard, fruit, tuna, sweets, potatoes, crisps, ketchup, mayonnaise, dilute fruit juice, cleaning spray. Items we put into the weekly food bags: tinned peas, sweetcorn, carrots, dried pasta, pasta sauce, teabags, coffee, sugar, biscuits, cooking oil, antiperspirant, feminine hygiene, laundry powder/liquid, washing up liquid plus all other non-perishable items.
