PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE

N.B. We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out.

FOOD ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: pasta sauce, tinned potatoes, chopped tomatoes, sweetcorn, carrots, garden peas, cereal & UHT milk.

OTHER priority items: tinned baked beans, soup, hot dogs, meatballs, custard, rice pudding, meat (corned beef, Pek, mince etc), tuna, fruit, sweets. shampoo, toilet roll, feminine hygiene.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: tinned chickpeas, kidney beans, gravy granules, dried pasta, tomato purée, long grain rice, ketchup mayonnaise, fruit squash, teabags, coffee, sugar, biscuits, cooking oil, toothpaste, antiperspirant, laundry powder/liquid, washing up liquid, spray cleaner, plus all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday, volunteers are in Immaculate Heart Church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop off donations then if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to. Easter Vigil and First Mass of Easter St Philip Neri Church, Dunston Holy Saturday 8 April 2023, 5.30pm



First Part - The Solemn beginning of the Vigil (Lucernarium)

- Blessing of the Fire and Preparation of the Candle
- Procession Lumen Christi (The Light of Christ) R/ Deo gratias (Thanks be to God). (sung three times)
- Easter Proclamation (Exsultet)

During the singing of the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) please respond

The Lord be with. **R/ And with your spirit.**Lift up your hearts. **R/ We lift them up to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. R/It is right and just.

Second Part - The Liturgy of the Word

Before the readings begin, Fr Peter gives a brief instruction. Please note after the Responsorial Psalm following each of the three Old Testament readings, all stand and the celebrant recites a prayer.

First Reading: Genesis (1:1-2:2)

Responsorial Psalm: R/ Send forth your spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth.

Second Reading: Exodus (14:15-15:1)

Responsorial Psalm: R/I will sing to the Lord, glorious his triumph!

Third Reading: Ezekiel (36:16-28)

Responsorial Psalm: As the deer pants for the water (Hymn No. 54)

After the third Responsorial Psalm and its accompanying prayer, the Gloria is intoned and sung. The altar candles are lit and lights illuminated throughout the church.

Epistle: Romans (6:3-11)

After the reading of the Epistle, all stand to sing Psalm 117 R/ Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 28:1-10

Introduction to the Gospel (sung) The Lord be with you. R/ And with your spirit.

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

R/ Glory to you, O Lord.

Conclusion of the Gospel (sung) The Gospel of the Lord, alleluia, alleluia!

R/ Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ, alleluia, alleluia!

Third Part - Baptismal Liturgy

Hymn during the sprinkling: 401 Water of life, cleanse and refresh us

General Intercessions R/ Hear our prayer.

Fourth Part - The Liturgy of the Eucharist

Offertory Hymn: In the earth No. 306

Eucharistic Acclamations: Mass of Christ the Saviour

Communion Hymn(s): Christ the Lord is risen today! No. 112 The Lord is alive S22 At the end of Mass, Fr Peter sings The Mass is ended go in peace, alleluia, alleluia!

The congregation all sing R/ Thanks be to God, alleluia, alleluia!

Recessional Hymn: Thine be the glory No. 728

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 10:34. 37-43

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: 'You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses – we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead – and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

After the Sabbath, and towards dawn on the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala and the other Mary went to visit the sepulchre. And all at once there was a violent earthquake, for the angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled away the stone and sat on it. His face was like lightning, his robe white as snow. The guards were so shaken, so frightened of him, that they were like dead men. But the angel spoke; and he said to the women, 'There is no need for you to be afraid.
