We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out.

FOOD ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: tinned custard, rice pudding, fruit, potatoes, baked beans, carrots, garden peas, sweetcorn, crisps, biscuits, ketchup, mayonnaise, cooking oil & spray cleaner.

OTHER priority items: cereal UHT milk, pasta sauce, tinned meatballs, hot dogs, soup, meat (corned beef, Pek, mince etc), tuna, chopped tomatoes, sweets & toilet rolls.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: shampoo, feminine hygiene, laundry powder/liquid, washing up liquid, antiperspirant, toothpaste, tinned chickpeas, kidney beans, gravy granules, dried pasta, tomato purée, long grain rice, , fruit squash, teabags, coffee, sugar, plus all other nonperishable items.

PARISH FINANCIAL REPORT 2022/23 The Financial Report for the 12 months to the end of March shows parish funds at £258,290 plus a total of £16,538 being held on behalf of Gift for Life, Foodbank and Special Collections. Parish funds have declined by £34,467 over the course of the year despite Offertory Collections/Gift Aid receipts of £65,892 being £6,508 (+11%) higher than last year and benefitting from £10,040 received in the form of will legacies.

There are 2 main reasons for the decline in funds:

1. Repair expenditure is extremely high at £65,000 and includes these works at St Mary's: replacement of church entrance doors/frontage (£9,960), hall exterior decoration (£2,160), new gas mains pipework for church and presbytery (£18,378), temporary (electric) winter heating for the presbytery (£7,055) and the installation of a new gas boiler for the presbytery (£5,540). The necessary roof replacement for Dockendale Cottage cost £13,867 for which, as landlord, we are responsible.

2. Utility costs have risen to nearly £23,000 in the face of price rises and increased consumption as the churches were open for the full 12 months after 2 years of only partial opening during the Covid pandemic with the associated saving in usage during that time.

Looking ahead and still to be considered are what we are to do about the replacement of the roof of St Philip Neri Church and in due course of wall heaters at Immaculate Heart Church. However, it is worth remembering that when the single parish was formed in 2018, our funds stood at £230,000, and we are now still nearly £30,000 better off and thankfully in a healthier financial position than many other parishes in the diocese.

Once again, thank you for your continued generosity which is very much appreciated.

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 6:1-7

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission to the faith.
