SAVE THE DATE - FRIDAY 8 SEPTEMBER! Advanced notice to all parishioners about a very special Evening Celebration planned for Friday 8 September 2023 to acknowledge three special occasions for us to give praise and thanks to Our God. Firstly, as many of you will already know, it is 50 years since the current St Mary's Church, Whickham officially opened its doors on 8 September 1973.

Secondly, this year is a special personal Anniversary for Fr Peter as he will celebrate the 40th Anniversary of his Priestly Ordination (8 October 1983).

The final addition to this special Celebration is recognising the 40th Anniversary of St Mary's Primary School, although strictly this special day was last year. However, it was decided to celebrate all these three significant dates together - how wonderful to have so much for our parish to commemorate and give thanks for!

The Evening will begin with a Special Mass of Thanksgiving at which Fr Peter will preside. This will then be followed by a shared supper in St Mary's Hall (and in the walled garden, weather permitting!).

PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE N.B. We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out.

FOOD ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: laundry powder/liquid, tampons, UHT milk, tinned tuna, hot dogs, meatballs, rice pudding & custard.

OTHER priority items: cooking oil, ketchup, spray cleaner mayonnaise, sugar, cereal, pasta sauce, tinned fruit, potatoes, baked beans, carrots, garden peas, sweetcorn, soup, meat (corned beef, Pek, mince, stewing steak etc), chopped tomatoes, crisps, biscuits, & toilet rolls.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: shampoo, feminine hygiene antiperspirant, washing up liquid, toothpaste, tinned chickpeas, kidney beans, gravy granules, dried pasta, tomato purée, long grain rice, fruit squash, teabags, coffee, & sugar plus all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday, volunteers are in Immaculate Heart Church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop off donations then if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to. First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 1:12-14

After Jesus was taken up into heaven, the apostles went back from the Mount of Olives, as it is called, to Jerusalem, a short distance away, no more than a Sabbath walk; and when they reached the city they went to the upper room where they were staying; there were Peter and John, James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Jude son of James. All these joined in continuous prayer, together with several women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.
