SAVE THE DATE CORRECTION & TWO APOLOGIES Advanced notice to all parishioners about a very special evening celebration planned for Friday 8 September 2023 to acknowledge NOT 3 special occasions but 4 for us all to give praise and thanks to Our God.

The first was unfortunately left out in last week's announcement. On 24 August 1948, St Mary's Parish was established by Bishop McCormack with Fr Leo Pickering as the first Parish Priest, so 2023 marks the 75th Anniversary of St Mary's original foundation.

Secondly, as many of you will already know, it is 50 years since the current St Mary's Church officially opened its doors on 8 September 1973.

Thirdly, this year is a special personal Anniversary for Fr Peter as he will celebrate the 40th Anniversary of his Priestly Ordination (8 October 1983).

The final and fourth addition to this special celebration is recognising the 50th Anniversary of St Mary's Primary School (not the 40th as mistakenly announced in last week's newsletter). Although this special Anniversary was last year, we will celebrate all of these four significant dates together how wonderful to have so much for our parish to commemorate and give thanks for!

The Evening will begin with a Special Mass of Thanksgiving at which Fr Peter will preside. This will then be followed by a shared supper in St Mary's Hall (and in the walled garden, weather permitting!).

PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE N.B. We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out.

FOOD ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, pasta sauce, tinned rice pudding, custard & tomato purée.

OTHER priority items: laundry powder/liquid, spray cleaner, toilet rolls, cooking oil, ketchup, mayonnaise, sugar, cereal, tinned fruit, potatoes, baked beans, carrots, garden peas, sweetcorn, hot dogs, meatballs, soup, meat (corned beef, Pek, mince, stewing steak etc), chopped tomatoes, baked beans, crisps, biscuits.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: shampoo, feminine hygiene, antiperspirant, washing up liquid, toothpaste, tinned chickpeas, kidney beans, gravy granules, dried pasta, long grain rice, fruit squash, teabags, coffee, & sugar, plus all other non-perishable items.

Every Thursday, volunteers are in Immaculate Heart Church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop off donations then if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to.
