FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: pasta sauce, cereal, dried pasta, gravy granules, tinned garden peas, sweetcorn, sliced carrots, meat(mince, corned beef, pek), teabags, shower gel, feminine hygiene.

OTHER priority items: UHT milk, tinned custard, long grain rice, coffee, tomato purée, mayonnaise, ketchup, , tinned baked beans, chopped tomatoes, rice pudding, meatballs, hotdogs, fruit, tuna, potatoes, chopped tomatoes, baked beans, biscuits, cooking oil, laundry powder/liquid, spray cleaner, washing up liquid.

Other items we put into the weekly food bags: tinned chickpeas, kidney beans, fruit squash, toothpaste, shampoo, antiperspirant.
