PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE We welcome ALL non-perishable produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins, please bring them along to church to help out.

FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, tinned soup, tuna, meat (mince, corned beef, pek), sugar, anti-perspirant, shampoo.

OTHER priority items: all tinned vegetables (peas, carrots, sweetcorn, potatoes), hotdogs, meatballs, chopped tomatoes, baked beans, rice pudding, custard, tuna, cereal, dried pasta, pasta sauce, long grain rice, biscuits, crisps, gravy granules, squash, mayonnaise, tomato ketchup, tomato purée, teabags, coffee, cooking oil, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, spray cleaner, shower gel, toilet rolls, toothpaste, feminine hygiene (especially tampons).

Other items we put into the monthly food bags for the Refugee *Project*: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.

Every Thursday volunteers are in Immaculate Heart of Mary Church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop donations off then if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to. PARISH HALF-YEAR FINANCIAL REPORT The Parish Financial Report for the 6 months April - September 2023 reveals parish funds have fallen by just under £7,000 to £251,845.

Income is primarily made up of offertory collections of £28,120 and rental income of £11,742 from the presbytery, hall and cottage at St Mary's, Whickham. Fundraising, donations and votive candles contribute a further £2,352.

Expenditure is spread over a number of categories including utilities (£9,390), staff wages (£9,041), clergy costs (£6,134), diocesan levy (£5,360), repairs (£4,326), insurance premiums (£3,770), gardening services (£2,990), Joe's Place donation (£1,494), anniversary celebration expenses (£1,177) council tax (£1,049) and various church requisites and parish office costs (£4,468).

One benefit still to be received is the Gift Aid claim for the 2022/23 tax year which should, hopefully, be in excess of £10,000. On the downside is an anticipated increase in spend on repairs with both Immaculate Heart and St Philip's church heaters in need of replacement and the spectre of St Philip's roof repair also hangs over us.

Therefore, your ongoing generosity in the form of offertory collections is vital for us to continue to maintain our buildings in the best condition possible and, of course, to support our missionary outreach. While it is pleasing to report that the offertory figure of £28,120 quoted above is a £768 (+2.8%) increase on the same time period last year, it is actually £4,275 less than the pre-Covid closure collections of April to September 2019 - hence the difficulty in growing parish funds. The parish continues to hold monies on behalf of Gift for Life, Foodbank and special collections totalling £12,640.

LOVE CHRISTMAS - GET INVOLVED - ADVANCE NOTICE Every Christmas the parish offers support to those in need at Christmas, and this year we intend to continue with this invaluable outreach work, again under the umbrella of the ecumenical UK Charity 'Love Christmas'. Last year our parish supported over 300 individuals during the Christmas season. The parish would like to repeat the previous years' amazing effort of supplying Christmas food hampers, presents to all recipients of the weekly Foodbank plus Brigitte Jones will be liaising and organising the Angel Tree Project for children identified as at risk of not receiving a gift this Christmas (for ease - exactly the same as we did last year - the gifts donated via The Angel Tree will include the 46 children from the food bank families we support). Finally, Gift for Life intend to sell handmade Christmas decorations and Christmas cards to help with their ongoing fund raising for this worthy project (dates of sales to be announced).

So how can you become involved?

- At the back of church there will be a list of special food items for the Christmas food hampers which you can buy remember if you would prefer someone else to shop for food or gifts on your behalf, please feel free to donate cash
 there'll be a box at the back of each church for any food donations purchased.
- You can opt to take a tag from the Angel Tree and donate a gift (please leave all gifts unwrapped but with the age & gender gift tag attached)
- You can also buy some Christmas cards to support the parish *Gift for Life* project.

Whichever way you chose to commit to this year's 'Love Christmas Project' someone, somewhere will be benefiting from your amazing generosity and they will be truly grateful.

- At the back of each church there's a food list of special items for the Christmas hampers. Please note, food items need to be handed in by weekend 9/10 December - there will be a box at the back of each church for these food donations.
- Each of our three churches will have an Angel Tree please remember the gifts are for the food bank children plus the children identified by Social Services as being at risk of not receiving a gift this Christmas.

Nearer to Christmas we will be announcing dates requesting volunteers to come along to Immaculate Heart Church to help wrap all the presents for our Food Bank & Social Services children plus helping to organise the Christmas food hampers. This huge task can only be successful with your brilliant support - last year's volunteers were absolutely amazing plus we all had a fun day.
