FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: dried pasta, long grained rice, tinned tuna, fruit, hot dogs, meatballs, meat (mince, corned beef, pek), cereal, crisps.

Other priority items: UHT milk, tinned garden pea, carrots, potatoes, sweetcorn, potatoes, meatballs, baked beans, soup, tomatoes, pasta sauce, biscuits, sugar, gravy granules, squash, mayonnaise, tomato ketchup, tomato purée, teabags, coffee, cooking oil, washing up liquid, spray cleaner & feminine hygiene(especially tampons), toilet rolls, anti-perspiration, shampoo, toothpaste & laundry powder/liquid.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.
