

Other priority items: pasta sauce, dried pasta, UHT milk, long grained rice, tinned hotdogs, meatballs, garden peas, carrots, baked beans, chopped tomatoes, soup, custard, rice pudding, meat (mince, corned beef, pek), tuna, cooking oil, gravy granules, crisps, biscuits, jam, cereal, squash, tomato purée, tomato ketchup, sugar, teabags, coffee, toothpaste, feminine hygiene (especially tampons), spray cleaner, washing up liquid laundry powder/liquid, shampoo, anti-perspirant, toilet rolls.
