

FOOD BANK & REFUGEE UPDATE We welcome all nonperishable produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins, please bring them along to church to help out.

FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, pasta sauce, tinned meat (mince, corned beef, pek), sweetcorn, carrots, potatoes, chopped tomatoes, fruit, mayonnaise.

Other priority items: dried pasta, long grained rice, tinned hotdogs, meatballs, garden peas, baked beans, soup, , tuna, rice pudding, custardgravy granules, crisps, biscuits, jam, cereal, squash, tomato purée, tomato ketchup, sugar, teabags, coffee, cooking oil, spray cleaner, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (especially tampons), toilet rolls, anti-perspirant, shampoo, toothpaste.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord.

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the Sabbath came Jesus went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit, and it shouted, 'What do you want with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him.
