PARISH FINANCE REPORT APRIL - DECEMBER 2023 The Finance Report for the 9 months to the end of December has been prepared and reveals parish funds have fallen by £3,334 to £255,495 which is an improvement on the first 6 months position.

Income is primarily made up of offertory collections of £43,568 and rental income from St Mary's, Whickham presbytery, hall and cottage of £17,936. Fundraising, donations and votive candles contribute a further £9,965.

Expenditure is spread over a number of categories including utilities (£15,850), staff wages (£13,637), clergy costs (£7,574), diocesan levy (£8,040), repairs (£6,605), insurance premiums (£5,889), gardening services (£3,712), Joe's Place Donation (£1,494), anniversary celebration expenses (£1,177), council tax (£1,574) and various church requisites and parish office costs (£9,252).

One benefit to be received during the 4th quarter of the year (January - March 2024) is the Gift Aid claim for the 2022/23 tax year which should be £8,227. On the downside will be an increase in repair costs with both Immaculate Heart and St Philip's church heaters being replaced and the bell tower at St Philip's in need of essential maintenance. The spectre of St Philip's roof replacement also looms.

Therefore, your ongoing generosity in the form of offertory collections is vital for us to continue our mission and to maintain our buildings in the best condition possible. While it is pleasing to report that the offertory figure of £43,568 is a £1,855 (+4.4%) increase on the same time period last year, it is actually £6,385 less than the pre-Covid closure collections of April to December 2019 – hence the difficulty in growing parish funds.

As a separate item the parish continues to hold monies on behalf of Gift for Life, Foodbank and special collections which total £18,988 at the end of December. Thank you all for your continuing support.

FOOD BANK & REFUGEE UPDATE We welcome ALL non perishable produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out. Monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, tinned hotdogs, tuna, soup, sweetcorn, carrots, garden peas, potatoes, chopped tomatoes, fruit, custard, rice pudding, biscuits.

Other priority items: dried pasta, pasta sauce, tinned meat (mince, corned beef, pek), meatballs, tuna, soup, baked beans, long grained rice, tomato purée, cooking oil, gravy granules, crisps, biscuits, jam, cereal, squash, tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, sugar, spray cleaner, teabags, coffee, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (especially tampons), antiperspirant toilet rolls, shampoo, toothpaste.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, for the Refugee *Project*: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.

Every Thursday volunteers are in Immaculate Heart church between 9.30am -10.30am so parishioners can drop donations off here if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello!' and see what we're up to. LOUDFENCE 3 - 6 MARCH 2024 A message from Bishop Stephen: 'I am delighted and honoured to say that together with Newcastle Cathedral [St Nicholas] and the Diocese of Newcastle we will be hosting a LOUDfence at St. Mary's Cathedral. It will begin with the 11.30am Mass at St. Mary's Cathedral on Sunday 3 March and will end with a Service in Newcastle Cathedral at 6pm on Wednesday 6 March. All are welcome to the Mass and the final Service. Both Cathedrals will be open during these days and people are welcome to come and pray or offer their thoughts for those who have suffered abuse in any way. There will be opportunities to leave prayer ribbons and other prayerful symbols inside and outside of the cathedrals, recognising that for some people entering a church will be distressing. There will be trained people available at both cathedrals to listen to and accompany those who wish to speak. You may recall I invited representatives of LOUDfence and victim/survivors to my Installation Mass last July. The prayer ribbons presented to me remain on my Chair as a reminder to never forget those who have suffered. The LOUDfence ministry is explained by its founders: "We want all survivors and victims of abuse to know that we believe you, we will hear and support you and we will do all we can to prevent this happening again. People are invited to join in by tying a ribbon, pausing to reflect, offering a prayer and making a resolution in solidarity with survivors," explains Survivors Voices and End Church Abuse activist Antonia Sobocki, who brought the first LOUDfence to the UK in 2020, at the parish of Kirkbampton, Cumbria. The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.
