FOOD BANK & REFUGEE UPDATE We welcome ALL non-perishable produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out. Monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, tinned hotdogs, tuna, chopped tomatoes, baked beans, fruit, custard, rice pudding, crisps, tampons.

Other priority items: dried pasta, pasta sauce, tinned meat (mince, corned beef, pek), meatballs, soup, sweetcorn, carrots, garden peas, potatoes, soup, long grained rice, tomato purée, cooking oil, gravy granules, crisps, biscuits, jam, cereal, squash, tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, sugar, teabags, coffee, biscuits, spray cleaner, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (especially tampons), antiperspirant toilet rolls, shampoo, toothpaste.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.

POTENTIAL LEGISLATION CHANGES REGARDING ABORTION

The Lead Bishop on Life Issues for the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, Bishop John Sherrington, has provided the following message for parishes and religious communities in England and Wales:

From the end of February, it is likely that the Criminal Justice bill will return to parliament and that amendments will be tabled to decriminalise abortion up to the point of birth.

As well as a direct attack on the dignity of the unborn, it is highly likely that these amendments, if passed, will have unforeseen consequences which could be very serious for both unborn babies and their mothers, especially given the increase in home abortions following the legalisation of the provision of abortion pills by post.

It is possible that there will be other amendments more favourable to the rights of unborn babies.

Work will be carried out by the secretariat, including the provision of a website tool, to allow people to contact their Member of Parliament.

It will begin at the 11.30am Sunday Mass on the 3 March at St. Mary's Cathedral and end with a Service of the Word at Newcastle Cathedral [St Nicholas] on Wednesday 6 March at 7pm. Everyone is welcome to these liturgies and to visit both Cathedrals during the days to offer their prayers and support for all who have suffered abuse within church communities and all contexts. We are invited to leave prayers and messages together with provided items like the prayer ribbons presented to Bishop Stephen at his Installation Mass, which are still tied to his Bishop's Chair. People can leave their prayers and messages within or outside of the Cathedrals, recognising some people would rather not enter a place of worship. There will be people available for pastoral accompaniment if that is requested. As a diocesan family we pray for all who have suffered abuse and recognise our shared duty to safeguard the vulnerable.
