FOOD BANK & REFUGEE UPDATE We welcome ALL non-perishable produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out. Monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

FOOD ITEMS IN SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, dried pasta, tinned chopped tomatoes, meatballs, hotdogs, tuna, custard, rice pudding, antiperspirant.

Other priority items: breakfast cereal, pasta sauce, tomato purée, tinned meat (mince, corned beef, pek), baked beans, fruit, soup, potatoes, sweetcorn, carrots, garden peas, long grained rice, cooking oil, gravy granules, crisps, jam, squash, tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, teabags, coffee, sugar, biscuits, toothpaste, spray cleaner, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (towels & tampons), shampoo, toilet rolls.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.
