PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE \*PLEASE NOTE (THIS WEEK ONLY) THE FOOD BANK WILL BE OPEN 9am-10am ON THURSDAY 18 APRIL.

N.B. We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out. Monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

FOOD ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: biscuits, pasta sauce, tinned potatoes, carrots, garden peas, custard, rice pudding, fruit, tuna, meat (mince, corned beef, pek), chopped tomatoes, antiperspirant.

**OTHER priority items:** UHT milk, gravy granules, tomato purée, squash, tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, cereal, dried pasta, cooking oil, tinned meatballs, hotdogs, baked beans, soup, sweetcorn, long grained rice, crisps, jam, , teabags, coffee, sugar, spray cleaner, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, feminine hygiene (towels & tampons), shampoo, toilet rolls, toothpaste.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.
