PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE N.B. We are short of most produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out. Monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

FOOD ITEMS IN VERY SHORT SUPPLY: UHT milk, tinned hotdogs, baked beans, soup, sweetcorn, potatoes, carrots, garden peas, tuna, meat (mince, corned beef, pek), chopped tomatoes, toilet rolls, antiperspirant.

OTHER priority items: gravy granules, tomato purée, squash, tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, cereal, dried pasta, pasta sauce, cooking oil, tinned meatballs, custard, rice pudding, fruit, long grained rice, crisps, jam, teabags, coffee, sugar, biscuits, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, spray cleaner, feminine hygiene - (towels & tampons), shampoo, shower gel, toothpaste.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.

I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
