PARISH FINANCES The parish accounts for the three months April - June 2024 have been completed and show that funds have fallen by £5,683 to a figure of £263,431.

Offertory collections of £13,525 are 4.6% down on last year with Easter falling in March rather than April being a factor. Income from the three parish rental properties (St Mary's Presbytery, St Mary's Hall and Dockendale Cottage, Whickham) was £5,864 which after attributable costs saw a surplus of £2,977 bolstering parish funds. Without this benefit the deficit for the quarter would have been £8,660.

Church specific expenditure is spread over a number of categories including utilities (£2,926), staff wages (£4,708), clergy costs (£2.176), diocesan levy (£2,957), repairs (£3,301), insurance premiums (£1,461), gardening services (£1,535), council tax (£550) and various church requisites and parish office costs (£2,596).

As a separate item the parish continues to hold monies on behalf of Gift for Life, Foodbank and special collections which total £13,112.

Once again, we thank you for your ongoing generosity in the form of Offertory Collections and donations as we seek to maintain our parish in as healthy financial position as possible.

PARISH FOOD BANK AND REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE FOOD BANK & REFUGEE UPDATE

We welcome ALL non perishable produce - even if you can only bring along 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out but monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

IN SHORT SUPPLY - UHT milk, toilet rolls, cereal, pasta sauce, dried pasta, tinned chopped tomatoes, baked beans, potatoes, soup, tuna, meat (corned beef, pek), custard, fruit, washing up liquid.

OTHER priority items - tomato ketchup, mayonnaise, tinned peas, carrots, sweetcorn, rice pudding, meatballs, hotdogs, long grained rice, tomato purée, toothpaste, cooking oil, crisps, gravy granules, biscuits, coffee, teabags, sugar, jam, shower gel, feminine hygiene - (towels & tampons), laundry powder/liquid, spray cleaner, antiperspirant, shampoo.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the refugee project, - tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.

Every Thursday volunteers are in Immaculate Heart Church between 9.30am - 10.30am so parishioners can drop off donations then if they wish - please come in to say 'Hello' and see what we're up to. SPUC PETITION SPUC (Society for the Protection of Unborn Children) is promoting a petition relating to the two-child benefit cap which has received recent publicity.

SPUC says: One of the biggest drivers in the UK is poverty and one particular policy which penalises families and contributes to poverty is the current government policy on Universal Benefits. Some abortion providers themselves have identified that the government's punitive two-child Universal Credit limit is 'a significant factor' in many women deciding to abort their children. The two-child benefit cap targets the poor and vulnerable. STATEMENT BY CEO OF CARITAS SOCIAL ACTION NETWORK ON RECENT PUBLIC DISORDER At Caritas Social Action Network, we have been shocked and disturbed at the violent scenes of public disorder in many parts of the UK in recent days and the levels of racism, Islamophobia and hatred against those seeking sanctuary in our country. We grieve with the families of the three young girls tragically killed in Southport whose lives were so brutally cut short and we remember their families in our prayers at this

unimaginably difficult time.

We have often seen good coming out of the most horrific circumstances, as people find in themselves their best instincts to repair and build community and stand against the forces of division and hatred. We hope that these tragic events mark a decisive turning away from the politics of hatred and division towards a spirit of solidarity and service. In the CSAN network, many of our members work in the most disadvantaged communities, seeking to restore human dignity and help to bring agency and hope to people on the margins of society.

In recent years, many of our members have supported people housed in hotels who are seeking asylum or awaiting more suitable accommodation. These people are often very isolated and vulnerable, many of them having fled violence and persecution in their home countries.

We stand in solidarity with all victims of violence, especially with our brothers and sisters seeking asylum, our Muslim brothers and sisters, and indeed with anyone feeling threatened because of who they are or where they are from. May they feel the love and support of their communities, and of those who hear Christ's call to love the stranger.

Bishop Paul McAleenan, the Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees at the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, has commented, "Today, and always, we need to continue to pray, work and stand together for peace in our country. The actions of the few involved in violence stands in stark contrast to the work of charities, church groups and volunteers who tirelessly extend the hand of welcome to migrants in acts of solidarity. We hope and pray that they will re-double their efforts so that we can rebuild communities after the terrible events of the last few days."
