Parliament returned and a Bill on assisted suicide (so-called assisted dying) started its passage through the House of Lords, our Lead Bishop for Life Issues, Bishop John Sherrington, called for Catholics to unite in prayer and compassionate action. On Wednesday, 16 October, the House of Commons heard the First Reading of a new Bill on assisted suicide tabled by Labour MP Kim Leadbeater. MPs will have the opportunity to vote on the Bill on 29 November. This is another attempt to legalise assisted suicide and you are encouraged to contact your MP to voice your opposition. The charity *Right to Life UK* has a simple online mechanism to do this. It takes little more than a
