OTHER priority items - Cereal, cooking oil, tomato purée, long grained rice, UHT Milk, pasta sauce, tinned meat (corned beef, mince beef, pek etc), baked beans , meatballs, custard, rice pudding, fruit, sugar, biscuits, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, shampoo, antiperspirant, toothpaste, feminine hygiene (especially tampons) & toilet roll
