SHORT SUPPLY: dried pasta, tinned tuna, hot dogs, vegetables - garden peas, sweetcorn, carrots, potatoes, chopped tomatoes, spray cleaner

OTHER priority items - Cereal, cooking oil, tomato purée, long grained rice, UHT Milk, pasta sauce, tinned meat (corned beef, mince beef, pek etc), baked beans, meatballs, custard, rice pudding, fruit, sugar, biscuits, toothpaste, washing up liquid, laundry powder/liquid, shampoo, antiperspirant, feminine hygiene (especially tampons), toilet rolls.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.
