OTHER priority items - dried pasta, pasta sauce, tomato purée, cooking oil, long grained rice, meat (corned beef, mince beef, pek etc), tinned garden peas, carrots, sweetcorn, tuna, meatballs, chopped tomatoes, baked beans, sugar, biscuits, toothpaste, washing up liquid, spray cleaner, laundry powder/liquid, antiperspirant, shampoo, feminine hygiene (especially tampons).

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the Refugee Project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.
