Here is a message from Nic Gilbert, Chief Executive of St Cuthbert's Care: As we enter the season of Advent, we pause to reflect and give thanks for the generosity and prayers of our diocesan parishes. For almost 80 years, your support enabled St Cuthbert's Care to offer practical help to those facing the greatest challenges in our communities. As our charity celebrates its 80th anniversary, we are preparing to launch a new initiative - a dedicated service to support women experiencing homelessness, leaving prison or at risk of reoffending. Many of whom have faced trauma, abuse or addiction and some have had few safe spaces in their lives. This new service will provide secure accommodation and traumainformed support, helping women rebuild their lives, regain independence access employment and move towards their own homes. Funding for this vital work is extremely limited, yet both our research and experience show the need is real. True to our purpose, to enable people to develop to their personal potential, we are stepping in where others may not, offering stability, compassion and practical support to restore hope and make a real difference. We know that not everyone can give financially, but there are other ways to support the launch. The women will need clothing, toiletries and in some cases, the wisdom and encouragement of parishioners willing to share their lived experiences. We also ask that you keep our charity, especially this new service, in your prayers as we prepare to open our doors. **FOOD BANK & REFUGEE PROJECT UPDATE\_**We welcome ALL non perishable produce - even if you can only donate 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out - monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

IN SHORT SUPPLY: coffee, UHT Milk, dried pasta, tomato purée, tinned custard, fruit, rice pudding, biscuits.

**OTHER priority items:** pasta sauce, cereal, cooking oil, long grained rice, meat (corned beef, mince beef, pek etc), tinned garden peas, carrots, sweetcorn, potatoes, tuna, meatballs, hot dogs, chopped tomatoes, baked beans, sugar, toilet rolls, washing up liquid, spray cleaner, laundry powder/liquid, toothpaste, antiperspirant, shampoo, feminine hygiene (especially tampons).
