

FOOD BANK & REFUGEE PROJECT We welcome ALL non perishable produce - even if you can only donate 1 or 2 tins please bring them along to church to help out - monetary donations are also very much appreciated.

Priority items: coffee, cereal, cooking oil, tomato purée, tinned fruit, sugar, washing up liquid, spray cleaner, laundry powder/liquid, shampoo & feminine hygiene (especially tampons).

OTHER priority items: UHT Milk, pasta sauce, long grained rice, meat (corned beef, mince beef, pek etc), tinned garden peas, carrots, sweetcorn, potatoes, tuna, meatballs, hot dogs, custard, rice pudding, dried pasta, chopped tomatoes, baked beans, biscuits, toothpaste, toilet rolls, antiperspirant.

Other items we put into the monthly food bags, especially for the refugee project: tinned chickpeas & kidney beans.
